A Kingdom of Magic

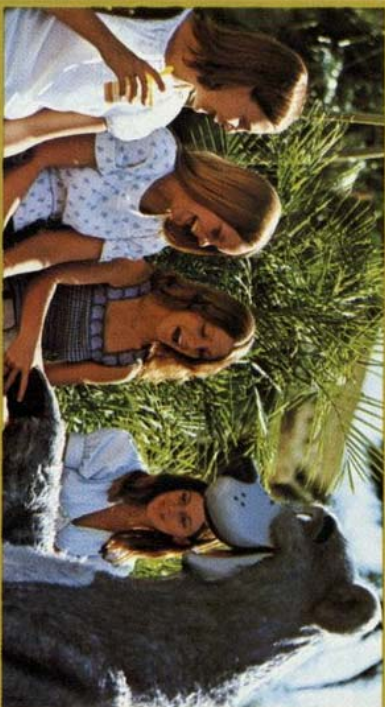
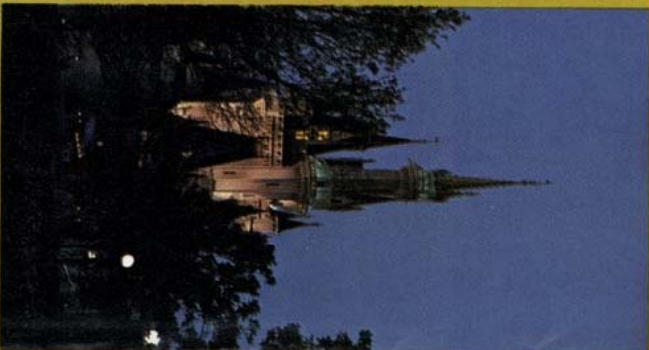
In the heart of Walt Disney World is the enchanting Magic Kingdom, a land of make-believe, where dreams come true. You'll find six lands with over 40 themed adventures and attractions recreating fairy tales and fables from the past, or making new legends for the future.

A Magic Kingdom visit includes a nostalgic and historic look at America on Main Street, U.S.A. and Liberty Square, and a salute to our Western heritage in Frontierland. Plus you'll enjoy the excitement of Adventureland, a visionary Tomorrowland look into the future, and the whimsical make-believe of Fantasyland.

Your day will take you from horse drawn carriages and steam powered railways to Skyways and tumbling outer-space rockets. You'll be entertained by the funniest group of bears that ever sang in the old West, and a family of spooks residing in a Haunted Mansion. Water excursions will take you down river in a sternwheeler paddleboat or on the Caribbean for a Pirate's adventure. And from every point, you'll see the towering Cinderella castle. Every day is a day of fun and fantasy inside the Magic Kingdom at Walt Disney World.

New Sights for '75

Visit Mission Control, then blast off into space on Mission to Mars, opening summer of '75. Experience Space Mountain, a whirling, dizzying rocket journey through space, presented by RCA. See America in the exhilarating CircleVision 360 presentation of "America the Beautiful," a salute to the Bicentennial by Monsanto. Take your own spacecraft soaring and dipping through Tomorrowland skies aboard a StarJet. Or become part of an audience reviving around a stage, where you see the innovations and inventions of yesteryear, in the General Electric Carousel of Progress.



Discover The Village

Just beyond the Magic Kingdom, you'll find a world of discovery inside The Lake Buena Shopping Village. A village of twenty-nine cedar-shingled shops and four distinctive restaurants. In a setting of brick and weathered wood, bordered by greenery and a blue lagoon. Here you'll watch Old World craftsmen at work in the arts of gold engraving, crystal cutting, pottery, or even hand rolling a cigar. You can browse a collection of shops where you'll find high fashion for her and him, posh pets and pottery, silver candelabra and sweet confections. Discover the

Lake Buena Vista Village — whatever you're expecting, it's more.

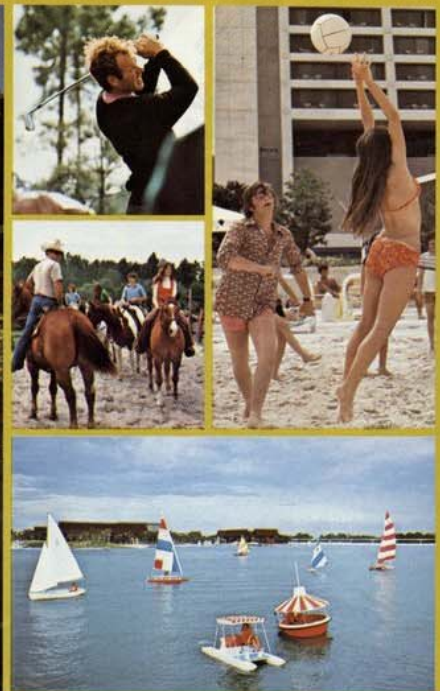
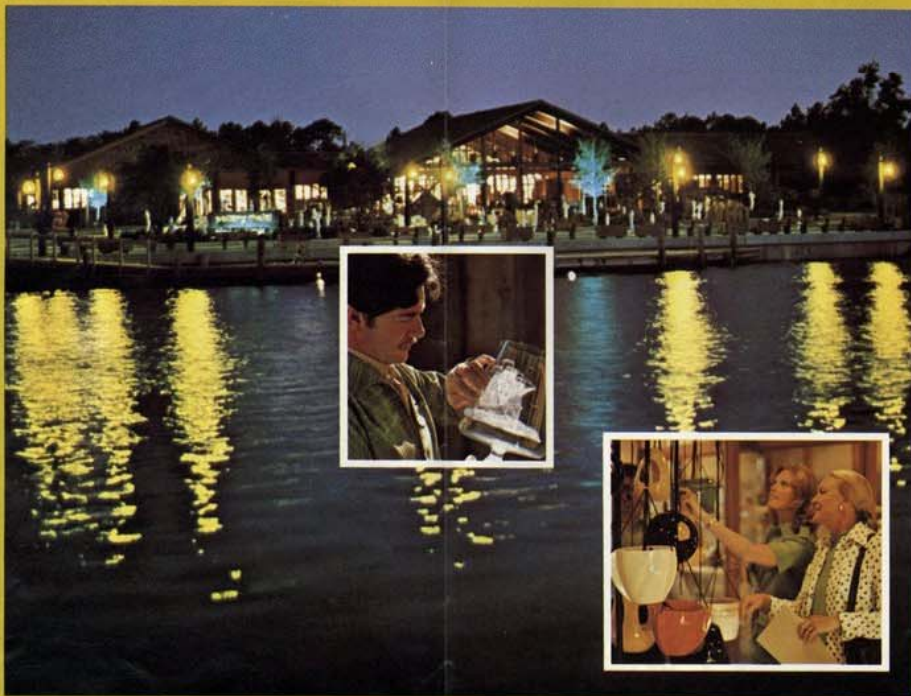
Also in the Host Community to Walt Disney World are four high-rise hotels, in the Lake Buena Vista Hotel Plaza.

And a short way down the waters of the blue lagoon, you'll find the Lake Buena Vista Club, equipped with tennis courts, swimming pool and golf course, plus a fine menu for dining, in the atmosphere of a private club, but available to all Walt Disney World guests. To get to Lake Buena Vista, take the SR 535 exit from the I-4 expressway.

A World of Resorts

Within the realms of the Vacation Kingdom, you'll find endless recreation and entertainment. The Polynesian Village and Contemporary Resort Hotels offer swimming, waterskiing, and boating. Golfers can choose from two championship courses at the Golf Resort Hotel, and tennis buffs will find courts everywhere. Outdoor recreation abounds at Fort Wilderness Campground Resort with horseback trail riding, hiking, bicycling and water sports.

Evening entertainment includes almost anything you'd like to do. A Polynesian luau, quiet dinner, musical "Hoop-De-Do," campfire sing-along, or dinner show with dancing at the "Top of the World."



Magic Kingdom Theme Park:

Spend two days exploring 6 themed lands with more than 70 restaurants and shops and over 40 attractions.

Summer Hours: 9 A.M. till 1 A.M., effective June 7 - August 30.

Contemporary Resort:

Ride the monorail through the fourth floor concourse. Enjoy name entertainment and dinner-dancing at the "Top of the World."

Treasure Island:

Sail to a tropical paradise where you'll travel pathways of exotic vegetation and "chat" with island birds. Set sail from the Magic Kingdom, Contemporary Resort or Fort Wilderness.

Moonlight Cruise:

Take a romantic cruise around the Waters of the World aboard an 1890's style paddlewheeler.

Polynesian Village:

South Seas atmosphere with days of swimming and boating, and a nightly luau of island cuisine and native dancing.

Golf Resort:

Two championship courses, the Palm and Magnolia, plus tennis, swimming and atmosphere dining.



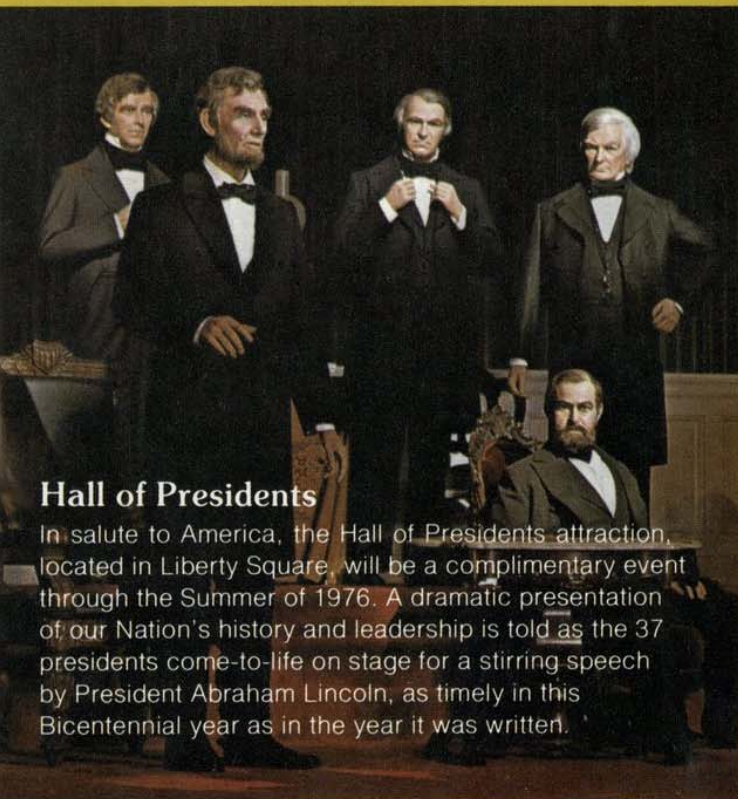
Fort Wilderness:

America on Parade

In celebration of America's Bicentennial, Walt Disney World presents America on Parade. It's a star spangled spectacular, commemorating America's inventions, heritage, symbols, entertainment and lifestyles, featuring colorful floats, music and a whole new family of characters. This larger-than-life procession will follow our Nation's history from the discovery of America to the Space Age. Mickey Mouse, Donald Duck and Goofy, as the "Spirit of '76," will lead this Bicentennial salute down Main Street, U.S.A. daily through the Summer of 1976.



Hall of Presidents

In salute to America, the Hall of Presidents attraction, located in Liberty Square, will be a complimentary event through the Summer of 1976. A dramatic presentation of our Nation's history and leadership is told as the 37 presidents come-to-life on stage for a stirring speech by President Abraham Lincoln, as timely in this Bicentennial year as in the year it was written.

Ticket Books

Ticket Books are recommended for maximum thrift and enjoyment: each includes one day's entrance into the Magic Kingdom and use of Walt Disney World transportation systems (monorail, ferry boat, motor coach.)
